Kevin Cooper was falsely convicted of the brutal murders of a Chino Hills, California family and a young houseguest in 1985, despite “substantial evidence that three white men, rather than Cooper, were the killers.” *Cooper*, 565 F. 3d. at 584.

Prop. 34, on the November 6th ballot, would eliminate the death penalty in California and replace it with life in prison without the possibility of parole.
